6:08 pm	<ul> <li>Round Robin: What are some problems/ concerns you've identified at public parks in your outreach?</li> <li>VTF members shared some of the challenges they have encountered/ identified at a THPRD park or facility during their outreach.</li> <li>Ronald shared that lack of recycling at parks during larger events is a persistent issue.</li> <li>Shreya mentioned lack of composting stations, restrooms, shaded areas to sit in public spaces are a few of the challenges.</li> <li>For Holly, the ability or inability to walk to a public park often determines usability; she mentioned that safe pedestrian access, especially to a park or an event, should be considered when planning events. Holly also identified that most of the current playgrounds are only meant for younger kids.</li> <li>Olivia brought up that the need for better and clearer signage (larger more visible boards and markers) is crucial in parks and trails.</li> <li>Rachel suggested that having a "phone app" for finding nearby parks and trails would make it easier for people to explore more THPRD areas.</li> <li>Reid shared that most parks and open spaces have limited usability in winter. He suggested having better lit parks and trails to make commuters and users feel safe.</li> <li>Bathrooms, benches, lights, sufficient garbage, and recycling options were some of the concerns that Ann identified through her summer outreach work.</li> <li>Richard shared that 'natural parks' should be maintained better during the off-season and winter months.</li> <li>Additionally, VTF members suggested that using rubber matting in playgrounds, motion sensor lights, solar-powered lights in fields, and creating playgrounds that appeal to everyone would make THPRD parks and facilities more attractive to people.</li> </ul>
